

Kentucky [SB76](#) - The "Kentucky Student Privacy Act"

Summary: Ensures that student privacy exists in school restrooms, locker rooms, and showers; require students born male to use only those facilities designated to be used by males and students born female to use only those facilities designated to be used by females; identify consequences for using facilities designated for the opposite biological sex; identify the Act as the Kentucky Student Privacy Act. Allows for civil penalties to be imposed (\$2,500) for violations of the act.

Florida [HB 583](#)

Summary: Requires that use of single-sex public facilities be restricted to persons of sex for which facility is designated; prohibits knowingly & willfully entering single-sex public facility designated for or restricted to persons of other sex; provides criminal penalties; provides private cause of action against violators; provides exemptions; provides applicability with respect to other laws; provides for preemption.

Texas [HB 2801](#)

Summary: Requires "only persons of the same biological sex may be present at the same time in any bathroom, locker room, or shower facility in a building owned by the district."

Allows for civil penalties to be imposed (\$2,000) for violations of the act.

Minnesota- [SF 1543](#) – [Student Physical Privacy Act](#).

Summary: The legislation would overturn the Minnesota State High School League's recent decision to allow boys who think they are girls to play on the girls' sports team. The legislation would also require public schools to provide restrooms, locker rooms, changing rooms and shower rooms for the exclusive use of either the male sex or the female sex, allowing for additional accommodations to be made if needed.
